**Discrimination****Fox News Job Bias Lawsuit Picks Up Disability Claim***By Jon Steingart*

A Fox News employee added a disability discrimination claim to a lawsuit alleging that the company tolerated a hostile work environment created by a longtime executive (*Brown v. Twenty-First Century Fox, Inc.*, N.Y. Sup. Ct., No. 22446-2017, *complaint amended 4/4/17*).

Monica Douglas, manager of the network's credit and collections department, allegedly was called a "one-boobed girl" by Judy Slater, Fox's former controller and senior vice president of accounting. Slater, a 19-year veteran of Fox, made additional comments about the apparent asymmetry of Douglas' bust, according to the claim.

Douglas had undergone a mastectomy to treat breast cancer.

Slater also mocked Douglas' speech because she is black and Panamanian, the complaint says. Slater made fun of her hair's texture and a black colleague's wig, it says.

Douglas decided to join the lawsuit filed April 3 after Twenty-First Century Fox Inc. said it fired Slater after learning of the racial harassment accusations, according to the complaint. Douglas previously lodged her own complaints about Slater's racially tinged comments but the company took no action, the lawsuit says.
